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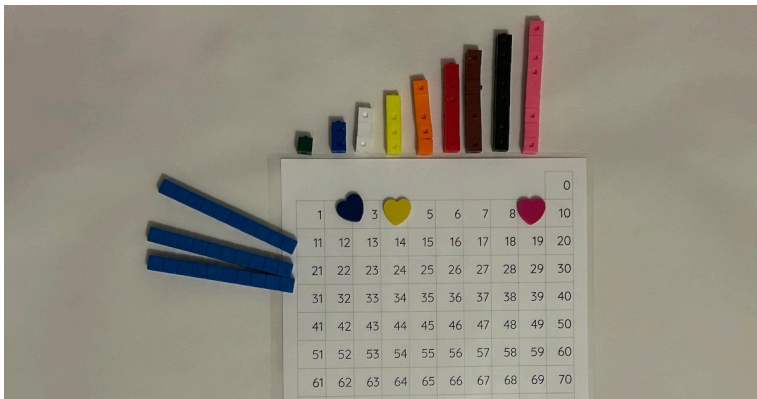
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## How to use the material

- Decide which format you want to use:
  - page 1: 0-100 with 10s at the end.
  - page 2: 0-100 with 10s at the beginning. This format has all 20s etc. in one row.
  - page 3: Blank chart 1-100 for filling in numbers or shading percentages.
- Decide whether you want to laminate the page for repeated use or just print it out so that your learner can, e.g., color some of the squares.
